2020 Census Partner Spotlight

- As of June 18, Census workers have completed 96 percent of the 2020 Census "Update Leave" operation, where census invitations and paper questionnaires are delivered to households in certain areas across the country. In these areas, most households generally do not receive mail at their homes, so census materials must be delivered in person. When the operation is complete, nearly every household nationwide will have received an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census.
- The U.S. Census Bureau is reaching out to colleges and universities with significant off-campus student populations to help ensure they are counted in the right place for the 2020 Census. Earlier this week, Director Dr. Steven Dillingham sent a letter to college and university presidents asking them to provide information for off-campus students. For more information, please read here.
- As of June 18, 61.5 percent of households have responded to the census. The Census urges households to respond now by completing and mailing back the paper questionnaire, responding online at <u>2020census.gov</u>, or by phone at 844-330-2020 using the provided Census ID.
- Census workers are dropping off census materials at roughly 6.8 million households nationwide, including Puerto Rico. In some areas of the country, the operation is complete, and in others it will be completed soon. Census workers are also updating address lists in these areas.
- Currently, nearly four out of 10 households have not responded to the 2020 Census. The Census Bureau urges every household to complete it as soon as possible. Households that do not respond on their own will be visited by a census taker.

2020 Census Partner Spotlight

The National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) Houston Chapter, State Representative Ron Reynolds, Councilmember Jeffrey Boney, and members of the Houston Census team met at Hunters Glen Park in Missouri City in honor of Juneteenth. Representative Reynolds is the co-organizer of the Missouri City Health Care Giveaway and invited the NPHC and the census to



assist and distribute census information, free PPE bags, and other promotional items to increase self-response. The census team shared text codes with access to the self-response site to fill out census questionnaires.
