Sturgis Bike Park Expanding

As a result of high-use and generous donations made by our area businesses and residents, the Sturgis Bike Park is in the process of expanding.

The park currently has BMX jumps, 2 pump tracks, and a skills park and is open from sunrise to sunset. You can find 40 to 50 kids at the park at any given time throughout the busy summer months.

The goal is to add more pump tracks to the facility and the Police Athletic League (PAL) is taking donations to make the expansion possible. The bike park is located east of Woodle Field along the Bear Butte drainage.

Fundraising efforts are ongoing. A Cornhole Tournament is scheduled for June 1 at the Loud American Roadhouse.

Sturgis Among Top 10 Safest Cities in South Dakota

SafeWise recently named Sturgis as the 6th safest city in the state based on crime rates.

SafeWise security analyst Rebecca Edwards said, "It's no surprise that the safest cities echo the state's overall lower crime rates."

Even with several major tourist events, such as the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, each city on the list saw fewer than four violent crimes per 1,000, and 80% kept property crime below both state and national rates.

Sturgis was ranked #9 last year. Brandon was named #1 Safest City in South Dakota.
